## Activities of AATA in 2018 in Chronological Order

In response to a recommendation in a questionnaire distributed by AATA to its members in 2015, AATA decided to revive the Arabic Translation Contest. We are happy to announce that it was achieved with the monetary support of some institutions and that of a few individuals as well as the diligent, voluntary service of Judges who spent many hours to complete the task of reading, reviewing, commenting, discussing and evaluating their assigned passages.

The Translation Committee first advertised this activity in a document entitled **ARABIC TRANSLATION CONTEST ANNOUNCEMENT** in AATA's Newsletter, March 21, and posted it on its AATA's website then. Additionally, this document was posted on various listserves and social media in order to widen the scope for recipients and reach as many academic communities as possible.

> The document contained details of the procedure to be followed, among which are the genres of passages, eligible participants, what and what not to include, the submission date, length of pages, the number and amount of prizes, and Judges' submission date of their ratings.









- ➤ Individuals well known in Arabic English translation circles were contacted and 14 members graciously accepted to be Judges: seven were in charge of reviewing the literary passages and another seven of the non-literary passages.
- > Ten students submitted translation passages seven in the literary genre and three in non-literary genres. We hope that there will be more submissions in the forthcoming years.
- > The Translation Committee sent the Judges a Rubric for the Evaluation of the Arabic Translation Passages comprising of these headings: Categories, Possible Points, Judges' Scores and Explanation of score awarded.
- > The evaluation was finalized with the literary Judges awarding one First Prize, one Second Prize and one "Honorary Mention", the non-literary Judges awarding one First Prize, and the Translation Committee awarding the rest of the contestants a Certificate of Appreciation.
- The awards will be announced and presented at AATA's forthcoming Business Meeting on November 15th in San Antonio, Texas.
- > The Coordinator, Paul Rossini, is to be applauded for his commission in synchronizing the contacts among the many Judges.
- Last, but not least, the Translation Committee Members express their deep appreciation to the Judges evaluation in a timely manner and without whose service this contest would not have met its objectives and deadline.
